South Sumter Park Updates:

- Thrilled about the progress of the project.
- Currently putting base coats on the basketball courts and installing fencing.
- Second phase of the project includes an airnasium. Thanked Representative Weeks and the Legislative Delegation for providing funding to make this part of the project a reality.
- Additional details regarding the second phase of the project are forthcoming.

Requested the following updates:

- Michael Geddings
 - Consumer Confidence Report (Drinking Water Quality)
 - South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control requires that the report be provided to city residents annually.
 - Official report is available on the City of Sumter website.
 - South Sumter Park
 - Project is on schedule.
 - Currently working on underground utilities and grading.
 - Preparing for the second phase of the project which will extend the timeline and cost.
 - Projected to finish the first phase by the end of 2024.
 - South Sumter Ark Park
 - Working on landscaping, painting, and other small tasks.
 - Project should be complete by the end of summer.
- John Macloskie Demolition Update
 - Three (3) Federally Funded Opportunities:
 - 1. Community Development Block Grant
 - Ten houses are scheduled for demolition



- 2. Funding appropriated through Congressman James Clyburn's Office:
 - \$850,000 (county)/\$750,000 (city)
 - Approximately one (1) month away from starting demolition.
 - Environmental study is complete and both structures have been scheduled for demolition:
 - 321 South Sumter (corner of Dingle and South Sumter Streets)
 - 421 South Main Street (structure at the rear of Emmanuel United Methodist Church)
- 3. Funding appropriated through Senator Lindsey Graham's Office:
 - \$750,000 (city)
 - Waiting to receive funding.

 - North Main Street Revitalization
