Mayor Pro Tempore Blassingame Attended the Pinedale Neighborhood Association meeting held at the South Hope Center on Thursday, August 15, 2024. Residents are appreciative of the current road resurfacing projects. City staff has been made aware of recurring issues with standing water in several neighborhoods. Thankful for members from the Guignard Park community being present for tonight's City Council meeting. **Councilman Hastie** Attended with Mayor Pro Tempore Blassingame, the South Sumter Neighborhood Association meeting held at the South Sumter Gym on Monday, August 19, 2024. Citizens expressed concerns about the recent shootings in the area. Representative David Weeks was in attendance to share updates and future events happening within the Sumter community. Signs have been placed throughout the city to bring attention to the **Councilman Corley** Capital Projects Penny Sales Tax Referendum. Hoping that the City of Sumter and Sumter County will consider improving the verbiage used to describe the projects before the November elections. **Councilman Shaw** Members of City Council were provided a copy of the 2024 Liberty STEAM Charter School Annual Report. Highlighted the following items from the report: Parents served 5,625 volunteer hours with a 99% family engagement satisfaction rate. - 71% of scholars were eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Currently 731 scholars enrolled.
 - Leased an additional 70,000 square feet of the Sumter Mall for future school expansion.
